**CCS Payments:** As the PIP CCS Registration window was extended to support services with more time to submit registrations, the Verification process and final Band Approval is not expected to be completed until the end of February 2015. To ensure CCS Services receive adequate payments until such time as final approval is completed a further CCS Preliminary Payment will issue to CCS Services. This payment will be the balancing payment due up to the end of February 2015, based on the 'PROVISIONAL' bands applied for through the PIP CCS Registration process. Payments will be made by Friday 6th February and are subject to Tax Clearance Certificates being in date .

## Qualifications in the ECCE Sector

**Reminder:** From September 2015, the pre-school leaders in ALL services participating in the ECCE programme will be required to hold a certification for a major award in childcare/early education at a minimum of level 6 on the NFQ, and all staff working with children in the service will be required to hold a certification for a major award in the childcare/early education at a minimum of level 5 on the NFQ.

## Easter Activity

### PAPER BUNNY CUP Treat Holders

You will need:

white paper cup, white card  
pink felt or pink card  
2 wiggle eyes  
small pink pom-pom  
medium white pom-pom (for tail)  
white chenille stems/pipe cleaners  
scissors, glue, glue dots or a stapler



### Directions

From the white card, cut 2 large white ovals for the bunny ears. Trim one side of the oval off so it's squared off at the bottom.

Cut 2 smaller oval shapes from the pink felt (or paper) for the inner part of the ear. ••• Glue the pink ovals in the center of the white ear shapes and set aside to dry.

Cut white chenille craft stems into short pieces for the whiskers. Use craft glue or glue dots to attach the whiskers to the cup, then glue the pink pom pom on top for the nose.

Attach the ears to the back rim of the cup with a stapler or glue dots. Glue the white pom pom to the back of the cup to create a cotton tail.

Fill with a colorful Easter grass and sweet treats!

ACT for meningitis was set up by Siobhan and Noel Carroll in 2011 after sadly losing their precious daughter Aoibhe, aged 4, to the devastating disease. When Siobhan and Noel left the hospital after Aoibhe had passed they found they had nowhere to turn and felt very much alone in their tragedy. They felt there was an urgent need for more awareness about meningitis and for support for people affected by it. ACT for meningitis believes awareness can save lives and nobody should face the meningitis journey alone.

Meningitis is an infection of the membranes surrounding the spinal cord and the brain. It can kill within hours and can affect anyone of any age. Ireland has the highest incident of meningitis per capita in the whole of Europe and there are currently no vaccinations against all the different strains of the disease.

We are now the only charity in Ireland to offer a wide range of free support services to those affected by Meningitis. Our services include free counselling services for families or individuals who have been affected by Meningitis, one to one support and contact with someone who has had a similar experience to yourself can provide valuable support, free family support days aimed at bringing families together to share their experiences of Meningitis -Parents can get to meet each other while their children can play together, creative therapies-including play and art therapy which helps children deal with the impact of the disease and alternative therapies including Emmett & Bowen therapy. We also distribute hundreds of meningitis awareness cards around the country every week and also give free Meningitis

**DO NOT WAIT FOR A RASH! It is a common misperception that meningitis always produces a rash, in many cases a rash is not present at all or appears at a very late stage of the infection taking hold.**

Meningitis does not always produce a rash. If it does appear it will not fade under pressure.

- Press the side of a glass firmly against the skin
- Spots/Rash may fade at first, keep checking
- Some are more difficult to see on darker skin, check paler areas in case

## Charitable Status

The Charities Act was passed in 2009 and due to the economic recession was not implemented till now. As of 16/10/2014 all charities that had a CHY Number will formally become registered charities under the 2009 Act and their names and addresses will be published on a new CRA Register of Charities. CHY Charities do not have to do anything they are automatically registered.

Over the coming months all CHY charities will receive a letter from the CRA inviting them to create an online account to supply additional information for the Register, including annual reports, accounts and governing documents. There is no prescribed format or content for reports and accounts submitted during this process. Annual reports and accounts will fall due 10 months after the charities first financial year end date after registration on 16th October, 2014. This means that the earliest that any charity will have to submit a report and accounts is August 2015 by which time it is likely that regulations will have been made by the Minister to set the standards for these reports. The CRA will advise charities on what is expected in advance. Charities are not required to take any action until the CRA has written to invite them to do so. ## New Food Labelling Legislation

On the 13th December all food businesses will need to comply with new food labelling legislation which was introduced by EU law in relation to non-pre packed foods. All food business serving non-pre packed food must list the potential allergens used in the food.

### Who does this law effect?

This new legislation includes and effects all early childhood care and education service that serve non-pre packed foods. It requires all childcare services providing food for the children to list the potential food allergens contained in the meal which is being offered.

### Why is this information important?
